Two outsiders. Two secrets. David longs to be a girl. Leo wants to be invisible. An unlikely friendship forms.

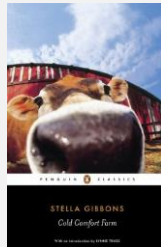


Butter by Erin Lange. Gasp, laugh and cry at one boy's journey from lonely outcast to toast of the school as he prepares to eat himself to death.

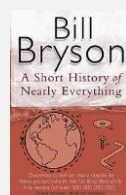
Cold Comfort Farm details what happens when a bossy city girl tries to meddle in country affairs.

Bill Bryson describes himself as a reluctant traveller but even when he stays at home he can't contain his curiosity about the world around him. Funny and insightful.

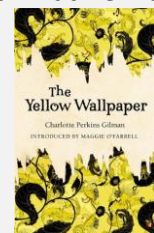

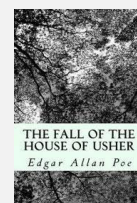
