**Things to include in your letter:**

- Start with *Dear my future year 11 self*
- In the first paragraph, talk about how you feel coming into year 7. It will be nice to reflect and look back on this when you reach year 11!
- In the second paragraph, write about all of the things that you would like to achieve in your time at Archer. What will you have improved in? What will you have learnt?
- Third paragraph: What will you have enjoyed the most? What trips will you have been on? What experiences will you have had?
- In the fourth paragraph, it would be great to hear what your hopes are for the future. What are your hopes and fears? What are you hoping to do when you are older?
- Conclude your letter and sign off.

Thank you for writing to us! In November you will be able to have an opportunity to write again, but then it will be to your Year 6 teacher, to say "Hello" and tell them all you've been up to at the Archer Academy. Good luck with your final term as Year 6.
