An exploration of critical concepts and ideas eg sexism, racism, Communism, tribalism etc.


A unit on disease created in a pre-Covid19 world and now with added resonance. Lots of input from experts in the field of medical science.

A group endeavour to create a pitch for a Theme Park to experts from the world of business in a 'Dragons' Den' finale.







A taster of some of the key philosophical ideas and their application to every day life eg The Trolley Problem and what makes us human.....

Discover more about Chinese culture and celebrations and create your own group puppet show – creating the legend and puppets together.




An exploration of the local area with a focus on how to improve it for the whole community, culminating in a spoken assessment of their ideas.
