# **DEPTH ASSESSMENT FORTNIGHT – Mrs Gillham**

# FLU IMMUNISATION - Ms Rodis

Flu immunisations are taking place at Lower and Upper school sites on the afternoon of **Monday 27th November 2023** for the whole school (Year 7 to 11). This involves a nasal spray only (i.e. no needles).

If your child has ever had a severe allergic reaction (anaphylaxis) to egg in the past, or asthma that's being treated with steroid tablets, or has required intensive care treatment in hospital, then please seek advice first by contacting the Barnet immunisation team on 020 8447 3622.

This vaccine contains porcine gelatine, so if you prefer to avoid pork products, please contact the team above to discuss possible alternatives.

The nurse team will only provide the vaccine if prior online permission has been given by parents. To provide consent, please click on the link below by **23rd November**. The school code is: CL139594

Please tell your child when you've submitted your permission, and remind them nearer the time, as this will help us manage on the day.

# **ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY – Ms Mahoney**



We want to thank our students for the excellent start they have made in terms of attendance this academic year. Our whole school attendance figure is currently 96.2% and we hope to maintain this figure. Our data confirms that students with good attendance to the Archer Academy have 20% more chance of meeting or exceeding their academic targets at GCSE.

To celebrate good attendance we award students who have 100% attendance termly with certificates and weekly with golden tickets which allow students to jump the lunch queue.

As you may be aware, attendance to school post the pandemic has been an issue nationally across schools. Whilst the Archer Academy has maintained some of the highest attendance figures in Barnet our attendance figure has dipped. We have also identified higher numbers of students who are persistently absent. This is when a student's attendance is 90% or below.

We are very aware that there are individual circumstances that do impact on student attendance, but that students should be in school wherever possible. We know that post pandemic with more families working from home it is easier for students to remain at home if they feel unwell. However, we have seen, in line with the national picture, the direct impact of lower attendance on our student's academic grades. Students with attendance of 90% or below only have a 50% chance of achieving their academic target grades, if attendance dips below 85% students only have 40% chance of meeting their target grades.

If you have concerns regarding getting your child into school, please do not hesitate to contact your child's Head of Year. The NHS has also provided some helpful guidance on when to send your child to school. 
