





Archer Academy Year 9 Reading List

	<p>In this fascinating book, Tim Marshall explores the effects geography has on a country's culture, politics and policies. Also available in an abridged and illustrated edition.</p>
	<p>A group of teenage girls find themselves discussing the term consent, what it actually means for them in their current relationships, and how they act and make decisions with peer influence. Joined by their male friends who offer another perspective, this rich graphic novel uncovers the need for more informed conversations with young people around consent and healthy relationships.</p>
	<p>After a plane crash sees a group of seven teens washed up on a desert island, their first thought is survival. But a terrible secret from a party the night before has followed them ashore. Facing deadly threats and the fear of being stranded forever, they quickly discover that being the most popular kid in High School doesn't help when you're fighting to stay alive.</p>
	<p>Fifteen-year-old Muzna Saleem is used to being invisible. So no one is more surprised than she is when Arif Malik, the most gorgeous boy in school, takes a sudden interest. But Arif is hiding a terrible secret and, as they begin to follow a dark path, Muzna faces an impossible choice: keep quiet and betray her beliefs, or speak out and betray her heart.</p>
	<p>Life hasn't been great for Henry. His family is struggling with money and illness; he's still beset by grief over the death of his boyfriend. He's unexpectedly given a way out: the aliens who have been abducting him periodically over his lifetime give him an ultimatum: only he can stop the end of the world. Henry is left with a choice: push the button and save the planet and everyone on it...or let the world--and his pain--be destroyed forever.</p>

	<p>Twins Lottie and Eva couldn't be more different—but what they do have in common is their Jewishness, even though their family isn't religious. When their mother gets a high-profile job and is targeted by antisemitic trolls on social media, the girls brush it off at first - but then the threats start getting uglier.</p>
	<p>An essential introduction to 1800 years of the Black British history: from the Roman Africans who guarded Hadrian's Wall right up to the present day.</p> <p>Also available in a young person's version, abridged and illustrated with maps, photos and portraits.</p>
	<p>Ariel Stone has spent his life cultivating the perfect college résumé: first chair violinist, dedicated volunteer, active synagogue congregant, and expected valedictorian, until a failed calculus quiz puts his future on the line, forcing Ariel to enlist his classmate, Amir, as a tutor.
