# Year 8 Archer Academy Boys v Finchley Catholic High – Monday 5th February Match report by Luke B, 8I-ATH

In a tense quarter final match, we faced arguably the strongest team in Barnet who are currently top of Division 1. The Archer Boys started the match very slowly and went 1-0 down within the first 10 minutes and things got worse as we conceded 4 more goals leaving us 5-0 down at half time. With many of the boy's heads down Mr Cifci gave an amazing, inspirational team talk providing the boys with a glimpse of hope. The second half started with Archer scoring a goal and this gave us confidence and belief, this was soon followed by our second and third goals.

10 minutes remained and we still needed 2 more goals to go level and then out of nowhere, Sonny hit a fabulous strike from outside the box curling it into the left-hand corner. We continued to pile on the pressure looking for that all-important equaliser. With just a couple of minutes remaining, Jasper hit the most perfect volley, slicing it into the top corner leading to wild celebrations.

As the full-time whistle blew the game ended 5-5 but it wasn't over just yet. As it was a cup tie, the match went straight to penalties. Archer was the first to start and Mickey coolly fired home his penalty. The shootout continued with both teams scoring, missing and some outstanding saves from our keeper, Santi. It continued into sudden death and the 7th penalty was dispatched by Rupert. Finchley had to score to stay in it, their player stepped up and missed the target meaning. We were through to the semis and we could finally celebrate an amazing comeback and victory.

# FLAIR RACIAL EQUITY DATA - Ms Mahoney


As part of the schools Equity agenda you will be aware we have been focusing on talking about and identifying racial discrimination in our community. Over the past year we have been surveying staff and students using Flair Race and Ethnicity Analytics to understand their experiences of racial discrimination.

Last academic year we provided anti racism training and assemblies to students with a focus on them understanding what racial discrimination is and how to challenge these behaviours. This year our survey identified that racist jokes are still a concern amongst our student body and that we need to develop an apology framework. Staff want to feel more confident to challenge racist behaviours and have training in how to develop our curriculum so that it is more diverse. We have booked training for staff on globalising the curriculum on our INSET day on 20th March and we are going to revisit training on microagressions for both students and staff. This is difficult and challenging work, but we are proud of the progress we are making and the dialogue this process is enabling us.


# LIBRARY CORNER - Ms Appelquist




### Year 10 - Mr McSherry

### Year 9 - Ms Le




