# Struggling to get your child to attend school?

When the situation is one of Emotionally Based School Avoidance stress levels are high for everyone. Parents and Carers have a key role to play in supporting school attendance, however, can often be left wondering what is the best thing to do?

In this training we will look at why problems can arise and what are the risk factors. How the school avoidance is rooted in neurobiological systems (in an easy-to-understand way!) that can sometimes make behaviours difficult to understand and we will also consider why working together is the only path towards solutions. Whether you have a child who is experiencing EBSA currently or you just want to find out more, just in case, this is a space with a warm welcome and practical information to help you. We will consider each person's roles and responsibilities, working successfully as a multi-agency team and navigating a system which can feel both familiar and unfamiliar at the same time. There will be time for questions and discussion as we aim to provide you with up-to-date knowledge and skills for supporting children experiencing Emotionally Based School Avoidance.

**Trainer:** Your trainer is Amelia Brunt, a specialist teacher, trainer and supervisor working with educational complexity. With almost 30 years of experience as a classroom teacher, SENDCo and SEMH consultant, she works from a sound grounding of evidence-based trauma informed practice. This training will provide you with both a good place to begin and to develop your EBSA learning journey.


- If students don't do History they do not come in on Wednesday morning until breaktime.


#### Year 10 - Mr McSherry


#### Year 9 - Ms Le
