**SCIENCE WEEK AND NEURODIVERSITY WEEK – Mr Wick and Mrs Bickers**

This week we have been celebrating Science and Neurodiversity Week with a range of exciting workshops, lessons, assemblies and talks.

Each day focused on spotlighting a high-profile neurodiverse figure including Billie Eilish, Simone Biles, Tim Burton and Alan Turing. Students also enjoyed attending a neurodiverse book club, fact file trails, film screenings of the movie Gifted, and a forum for neurodiverse students to share their experiences of neurodiversity, facilitated by Barnet's Autism Advisory Team.

The week also included opportunities for students to take part in exciting lunchtime science experiments in the labs including shock therapy, electricity racing, molymod racing and sprat dissection. Year 9 enjoyed a Dr Szydlo science show and students across the school heard fascinating talks from external experts such as 'the life of a paramedic', 'is the world's deadliest animal coming to East Finchley?' by a leading scientist from The International Society for Neglected Tropical Diseases, and a designer who creates fashionable clothing for people with physical disabilities.

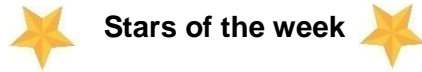
## Year 7 – Mr Raghveer

In our penultimate week, students have continued to impress me with their commitment to wider school life: I have seen students put in a lot of effort in Rugby training before school, basketball club after school and not least during our Safer Schools Day on Thursday. Additionally, our Girls Netball Team competed at the London Youth Games, winning 3 out of 6 games. Sporting prowess seems to be a consistent strength!

The Year 7 Tutor Team and our guests were thoroughly impressed with Year 7's inquisitiveness, engagement, and thoughtfulness during their Safer Schools workshops. Presenters commented on the willingness to be involved from our cohort, which fills me with pride. The day may have brought up some sensitive topics such as knife crime and radicalisation online, but students were able to manage topics well and discussed these in a mature manner. Do ask your child what they have learnt about being safe in the community to mirror the follow-up that will take place in school. This is always one of the most important days in our Lifelong Learning Curriculum, and it was so good to hear that students

approached this day seriously, and have taken on board the knowledge and advice provided to them by the experts.
