As governors we work as a team so we need a good balance of skills, interests and knowledge (including lived experience) to do the best job we can. We want to reflect the diverse backgrounds of our school community and whilst experience of working at a strategic level, in education or in other trustee roles can be helpful it is not essential, as full training and support will be given.

THE ROLE OF A SCHOOL GOVERNOR

Governors hold the school to account, acting as a supportively critical friend. We don't have any input into the day to day running of the school (such as curriculum, homework or school trips), instead we work closely with the headteacher and other senior leaders to offer strategic oversight in order to improve both pastoral and academic outcomes.

All governors are expected to attend Full Governing Board meetings which take place 7 times/year, last 2 hours and take place in the evening. We also have at least 1 annual awayday and there are 6 informal Strategy and Planning meetings a year. In addition you will be asked to join at least one of our committees, such as Pastoral and Wellbeing, Finance, Risk Management, Education & Standards, Resources or Fundraising and attend any relevant training sessions. Most governors are also a Link Governor for an academic subject or other important area of school life, which involves meeting with staff and reviewing information to understand the challenges and successes in the area concerned. The rest of the work, such as reading papers for meetings or reviewing committee policies, can be fitted in around the rest of your life.

As a school governor, you will be responsible for making important decisions that impact the school and its community, such as setting the school's strategic direction, monitoring performance, and ensuring resources are used effectively.

Some examples of how school governors can have an impact and make a difference include:

Improving educational outcomes: As a school governor, you will have a direct impact on the educational outcomes of the school. You will work with the headteacher and senior leadership team to set targets and monitor progress against them, and make strategic decisions to improve educational outcomes.

Promoting inclusion and diversity: School governors play a crucial role in promoting inclusion and diversity within the school community to ensure that it is providing a safe and welcoming environment for all students, regardless of their background or circumstances.

Building strong relationships with parents and the community: School governors can act as a bridge between the school and the wider community. You can work with the school to build strong relationships with parents and other stakeholders, and help to ensure that their voices are heard.

Managing resources effectively: School governors are responsible for ensuring that the school uses its resources effectively and efficiently. You may help the school to identify cost savings or work with the school to develop fundraising initiatives.

Developing and implementing policies and procedures: School governors have a key role in developing and implementing effective policies and procedures that impact the school and its community.



WHAT DO I NEED TO BE GOOD AT?

To be successful in this role, we are looking for people with a diverse range of skills and experiences. These may come from experience at work, through volunteering roles and from home and community responsibilities too. We don't need to all be expert at everything, but as a team we need to ensure we have the skills and experience we need around the table. All governors need to care about education and wellbeing, be committed to improving outcomes for young people, and have a desire to make a positive impact in their local community. Some of the competencies that we are looking for include:

- Willingness to be an active, hardworking and dedicated governor we ask for a commitment of 2-3 days/month (14-21 hours) during term time. This is mostly made up of meetings, pre-reading, school visits, training etc.
- Enthusiasm and a willingness to learn and develop new skills.
- Communication and interpersonal skills able to listen, reflect and challenge constructively ask incisive, probing questions, and work collaboratively with others.
- The ability to look at data and information, using it to make informed, evidence based decisions.
- A commitment to equality and diversity, and an understanding of the needs of different communities.
- Strategic, analytical thinking and the ability to contribute to the development of the school's long-term vision.
- Ability to be a good critical friend asking challenging and useful questions, whilst supporting staff to do the very best job they can
- Experience in education and/or governance would be an advantage, but it is not essential.

In addition we are looking for some governors with specific skills:, Education, Wellbeing & Safeguarding, Special Educational Needs (SEN), Finance & Fundraising, Our local community, Diversity & inclusion, Cybersecurity/IT and Communications.







About the school

Archer Academy was opened in September 2013 to meet the needs and desires of parents, primary school governors and the local community, for a first choice, non denominational, coeducational secondary school. Archer is significantly over subscribed with over 1100 applications for entry each year and our GCSE results consistently place us in the top 10% of schools nationally. Archer Academy was graded outstanding in all areas by Ofsted in 2019.

We have 162 students in each year group and are a campus school, a model which we believe allows us to create a distinctive atmosphere on each site. Our students complete Lower School, Years 7 to 9, at our Eagans Close campus, a state of the art building with incredible facilities. Students then graduate to Upper School at Beaumont Close, just a few minutes' walk away, in Year 10. Our campus provides each cohort the chance to grow and develop amongst their closest peers and creates a real sense of progress when students graduate to the college like atmosphere of Upper School, a rite of passage they aspire towards. The campus model also reinforces the small, community feel of our school.

We are currently an 11-16 school working in a strategic partnership with Woodhouse College for sixth form provision. This partnership is dynamic and evolving rapidly, securing a third transition point for our students and professional development opportunities for our staff. We are ambitious to continue to develop this provision over the coming years and see ourselves very much as an evolving 11-18 school.

Challenges and opportunities

Like all schools, we face both challenges and opportunities to enable all our students achieve their potential. For example, nationally against a background of challenging school finances, there are difficulties with staff recruitment, a well documented young peoples mental health crisis and we are dealing with the covid aftermath which affected so many children's academic and social development. However, our school is also fortunate to be able to create many opportunities to benefit our students. We have an engaged and supportive parent body, active volunteers, such as our green arrows who built our school garden, a caring approach to pastoral care with equine therapy and wellbeing week and a creative approach to developing the whole child. We have excellent links with our community and continue to harness our strengths to strive to improve in all areas.



WHAT DO OUR CURRENT GOVERNORS SAY ABOUT THE ROLE?

We are very lucky to have always had committed and engaged governors. This is what some of them have said about the role:

"Governance is incredibly rewarding. I enjoy working with a group of dedicated, intelligent people who have differing backgrounds and experiences that I wouldn't necessarily otherwise get to experience."

"I have always enjoyed volunteering and have had a number of volunteering positions over the past 20 years. I became a governor because I wanted to give back to my local community, and I felt I had skills, knowledge and experience to contribute, particularly around fundraising and community development. It has also given me a chance to develop new skills particularly around governance, finance and HR."
